based on an investigation he did for a socialist newspaper. The book depicts working class poverty, the lack

writer Jack London called it, "the Uncle Tom's Cabin of wage slavery." Sinclair was considered a muckraker,

or journalist who exposed corruption in government and business. He first published the novel in serial form in

1905 in the Socialist newspaper, *Appeal to Reason*, between February 25, 1905, and November 4, 1905. In

1904, Sinclair had spent seven weeks gathering information while working incognito in the meatpacking plants

of the Chicago stockyards for the newspaper. It was published as a book on February 26, 1906 by Doubleday

and in a subscribers' edition.
